Unfortunately it's not as simple as that. What you really need to do is take into account who were the bowlers in each individual match, and the pitch on which the game is played. If Ambrose and Walsh, or McGrath and Warne, or Wasim and Saqlain or whomever aren't playing, the attacks in question are not the lethal ones those basic stats assume them to be. And if the match is played on a flat track, versus a minefield or a bouncy greentop, it makes a big difference too. You need to take all those factors into account if you really want to make this comparison properly - otherwise it's not at all meaningful. Oh, wait. That's what the PWC ratings do. Doh. They're not perfect, and they're reflective of recent rather than career performance, but they're the best thing around to date if you want a purely statistical analysis. Rohan.
